



Conflict-Free Minerals Statement—December 2013

Silicon Motion is aware of concerns that certain minerals, including gold, tantalum, tungsten and tin, mined in conflict areas in the Democratic Republic of the Congo (“DRC”) and adjoining countries may be making their way into the electronics industry supply chain, and may be fueling human rights violations and environmental degradation.

As a fabless semiconductor company, we do not purchase minerals directly from smelters or mines, but are aware of the possibility that these conflict minerals may be part of the electronic industry’s supply chain. We strive for a DRC Conflict-Free supply chain by requiring our suppliers to comply with applicable laws and source materials that are DRC Conflict-Free.

We are working closely with our suppliers to understand the sources of the minerals contained in our products. Our due diligence includes using the Electronics Industry Citizenship Coalition-Global eSustainability Initiative’s (EICC-GeSI) Conflict Minerals Reporting Template with our suppliers to trace minerals back to the smelters and mines of origin and confirm that sources are included in the Conflict-Free Smelter program. Due to the complexities of our supply chain, we will continue to work with our suppliers on an ongoing basis to verify that our products contain Conflict-Free minerals.
